## 31<sup>st</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 5<sup>th</sup> November 2017

**“The greatest among you will be  
the servant of all”**

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks very strongly against the scribes and the Pharisees of his time. Jesus tells the people and his disciples what the scribes and Pharisees really are. He tells them that their teaching may be sound but do not follow their way of life because they preached one thing and did another thing. Hence Jesus says “Do what they tell you, but do not follow their example”. They were interested in reforming others rather than themselves. They made a show of themselves, appearing great before others. But Jesus called for equality among all: “we are all brothers and sisters of the heavenly Father”

In many ways Jesus calls us to be simplicity and humility. For example, he checked the ambition of Zebedee's sons to occupy the most coveted positions in the kingdom of Christ; he cautioned the disciples not to choose a more honourable place at dinner. In all these instances the demand is challenging and paradoxical: it is better to serve than to be served; it is safer to be below rather than above; it is greater to humble oneself than to exalt oneself. We are true Christians only to the extent we follow the example of Christ, who though great, humbled himself and became the servant of all. He teaches us today that the greatest among you will be the servant of all.
